Mark Scott Johnson, age 51, died Monday, November 11, 2013 at Platte, SD. Mark was born the son of Marvin and Marcy (Bjerke) on August 1, 1962. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Petri, Lutheran Church in Nome, ND. He graduated from Maple Valley High School in 1980. Mark attended Valley City State University earning an Associate Degree.
