Arthur Glenward Hermanson was born on August 22, 1915 on the family farm near Litchville, ND, the son of Gust and Anna (Johnson) Hermanson. He was baptized and confirmed at First Lutheran Church in Litchville. He attended rural school and one year at Litchville High School.

On November 10, 1945, he married Christine Gorden in Webster, SD. They made their home southeast of Litchville and farmed there until 1972. At that time, they moved to a farm north of Clauson Springs. In 1985, they retired from farming and moved into Kathryn.

He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Kathryn. He was a past board member of the Litchville #1 Kulseth School and the Litchville Township Board.

Art raised and broke horses and was one of the originators and participants in the Litchville Riding Club. His love for horse shows and rodeos was passed on to the rest of his family. Leather-work was a hobby of his for many years. He made many bridles and repaired harnesses and saddles in his basement workshop.

Art is survived by his wife, Christine of Kathryn; sons, Jim (Ilona) of Hermosa, SD, Dave (Mona) of Mandan, ND, Darrell (Nancy) of Kathryn, Terry (Lisa) of Mandan, and Mike (Laurie) of New Salem, ND; daughters, Sharon (Ken) Clauson of Kathryn, Sheryl (Rudy) Hanson of Valley City, and Judy (Rick) Vee of Hermosa, SD; 16 grandchildren; and 18 great grandchildren.
