Earl Martin Eggert was born on July 5, 1922 in Valley City, ND, the son of John and Alma (Johnson) Eggert. He attended and graduated from Grand Prairie School. In 1945, he entered the US Army and served until 1947.

In 1946, he married Beverly Jean Short on her family farm near Dazey. Earl started farming with his father-in-law. After the farm was sold, the couple moved into Dazey and he worked for Arnold Hammersmith doing carpentry work. Following Arnold's death, he started working for Webster's Plumbing in Valley City, until retiring. They continued living in Dazey. Beverly died in December of 1999. In 2006, he moved to Valley City and in 2008, he became a resident of Hi-Acres Manor in Jamestown, ND.

Earl was a member of the Dazey Volunteer Fire Department. He spent many hours taking care of the parks and mowing in Dazey. He was a member of the VFW and American Legion.

He is survived by his sons, John (Sharon) of Barnesville, MN and Kerry (JaNae) of Valley City; daughters, Diane Brandenburger of Jamestown and Tena (Steve) Pederson of Valley City; 11 grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren (number 7 & 8 on the way in September); a brother, Edward of Valley City; sisters, Mary Lou Tessin of West Fargo, ND and Annabelle (Morris) Tharaldson of Valley City; a brother-in-law, Esley (Darlene) Short of Luverne; a sister-in-law, Joyce Eggert of Minot, ND; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife; daughter, Linda Jean; and brothers, Les and Gordon.
