Lavina Mae Downing was born on February 13, 1925 in Ada, MN, the daughter of Bert and Emma (Edwards) Downing. As a young girl, her family moved to Waubun, MN where she attended school. Following her schooling, she worked in Fargo, ND.

On April 6, 1945, she married Leonard Gorden in Moorhead, MN. They made their home on a farm near Marion, ND, until retiring and moving to Valley City, ND in 1971. Leonard and Lavina lived there for five years before moving to Mesa, AZ where they stayed for thirteen years. In 1989, they moved back to Valley City.

She became a member of Faith Lutheran Church, Valley City, after transferring her membership at High Prairie Lutheran Church, rural LaMoure, ND. Lavina liked to bake and sew. She made many lovely crocheted doilies and beautiful quilts.

Lavina will be greatly missed. She died at the Villa Maria in Fargo, ND on May 14, 2011.
