



Leland Sabby

February 29, 1920 - December 7, 2008

Leland "Lee" Sabby was born in Rolette, ND, on February 29, 1920, and died on December 7, 2008 in Valley City, ND. Lee was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran church. His first four years of education was in Chicago schools. Grades 5-11 in a rural school, Wolf Creek Consolidated, near Rolette, ND, graduating from Rolette High School in 1938. He attended Luther College, Decorah, IA, and received a B.A. in mathematics in 1943. He enlisted in the USNR and attended Notre Dame University where he was commissioned ensign and then attended Harvard University for further training. Lee then served in the US Navy with the Seventh Fleet during WWII. After discharge from the Navy, he went into teaching. One year at Edinburg High School, ND, two years at Harvey High School, ND, and 35 years at Valley City High School.

In 1950, Lee was united in marriage with Ina Peterson in Jewell, IA. They have been blessed with four children. Lee is survived by his wife and his children: Paul, Minneapolis, MN, Mary (Greg) Allen, Jamestown, ND, Rachel (Jim) Jensen, Valley City, ND, and John, Edmond, OK, and by ten grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Lee earned his Masters of Arts degree from the University of N. Colorado, in 1953, and attended summer schools at UND, the University of Illinois (two summers), Stanford University (Shell Fellow) and the University of Denver.

Lee also served as Director of Teacher Workshops for NASA at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX for two summers.

In 1984, Lee received the Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching of Mathematics. Lee was appointed by four governors, both Republican and Democrat to serve on: Teachers' Professional Practices Commission and Board of Trustees of ND Teachers' Fund for Retirement State Investment Board. Lee was elected to serve in two sessions of the ND House of Representatives.

“ On his 100th birthday, I am thinking of Mr. Leland Sabby. Mr. Sabby (I could never call him Lee or Leland) was my high school math teacher for all 4 years. But he was much more than that. In our senior year we only had a few weeks of trigonometry and he told us to tell our university math placement counselors that. When I took the trig placement test, I had a perfect score. His teaching was that good. I remember the day after Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was shot, Mr. Sabby spoke emotionally and eloquently about what a great and courageous man Dr. King was. That had a profound effect on me. Before I headed off to college to major in math, Mr. Sabby gave me some introductory calculus material to work on. The summer after I graduated from UND, I met with Mr. Sabby when he was teaching a summer session to help elementary aged students strengthen their math skills. I learned techniques, games, and programs that came in very useful for my job interviews and my first years of teaching as some of the classes I taught were for high school students who were several years behind. Every time I came back to Valley City I visited with Mr. and Mrs. Sabby. We'd have cookies and lemonade on the back porch looking over their amazing back yard and discuss our lives and mathematics. One year I came to town with my family. I was so excited to have my wife and daughters meet the man who taught me so much and inspired me to be the best math teacher I could be. He brought out a mancala board that he had made, played a game of mancala with my daughter, Mandy, and then gave the board to us. Mr. Sabby and I shared Christmas cards for many years. I do not have the words to describe what he meant to me. His intellect, his desire to always improve, his caring ways, his awareness of the world beyond ND, his teaching methods, his love for his family, his being provided me with such inspiration. I loved that man. I didn't learn of his passing until several months later. I was devastated. I wish I had known when he died as I would have been there for his service. But today, I celebrate his 100th birthday (or is it his 25th?). Here's to a magnificent man and his life, well lived!

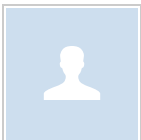


“ To Lee Sabby's family,
