Lloyd Edwin Duane Roberg was born on July 21, 1930, rural Kathryn, ND, the son of Anton and Emma (Anderson) Roberg. He was baptized and confirmed at Spring Creek Lutheran Church in Hastings, ND. Lloyd attended Daily School near Kathryn. After a time of farming with their father, Lloyd and his brother, Dennis went out on their own. They began dairy farming, and did so until retiring in 1997. Lloyd stayed on the farm until his health caused him to enter the nursing home. He moved into the Sheyenne Care Center in September 2009.

He is survived by his brothers, Dennis Roberg of Litchville, ND and Clifford (Lyla) Roberg of Billings, MT; sisters, Shirley (Earl) Stevens of Kathryn, Florence Hoff of Roosevelt, UT, Irma Kemmer of Lime Springs, IA, and Mary (Walter) Peterson of Valley City; and several nieces and nephews including a special nephew, Todd Stevens and a special niece, Dawn (Roger) Lausch and their children, Cody and Trevor.
