



Olaf G. Aune

January 12, 1909 - April 6, 2014

Olaf G. Aune was born January 12, 1909 at Mosvik, Norway, the son of Oldus and Karen Aune. He came to the United States with his family, April 10, 1910. He was raised on the farm and attended rural schools and graduated from Green Consolidated High School. He earned his elementary and secondary degrees from the Valley City State University, and also taught there one semester. He earned a Masters Degree from Moorhead State University. Olaf taught in several rural schools in North Dakota, and was a member of the Valley City School system for eighteen years. He served as principal of Washington Elementary school in Valley City for fifteen years. He also taught several years in the California schools. Later, he served as Department Manager of Grieger's Lapidary Inc. of California for seventeen years. In April of 1942, he married Mildred Kvilvang in Fargo, ND. She died March 4, 2001.

Olaf died April 6, 2014 at the Lutheran Home of the Good Shepherd in New Rockford, ND. He is survived by his son, Warren (Deb) of New Rockford; his daughter, Andrea (Robert) Fine of San Clemente, CA; grandsons, Andrew (Sabrina) Fine and Robert (Sandra) Wilson; granddaughter, Emily Fine; step grandchildren, Amanda (Ross) Nelson and Cory (Trista Hill) Hagen; great grandchildren, Logan, Lea, and Braydon; step great grandchildren, Emilee, Parker, Caleb, and Mila; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Mildred; sisters, Gusta (Martin) Nelsen, Jennie (Carl) Myhre, and Ragna (Glenn) Frederick; and

brothers, Justin (Amanda), Ole (Millie), and Arne (Bessie).

The funeral service for Olaf will be held at 2:00 PM, Thursday, April 10, 2014 at the Oliver-Nathan Funeral Chapel, Valley City. Burial will be in Woodbine Cemetery, Valley City, later this spring.

Visitation will be held at the chapel on Wednesday from 4:00 PM until 7:00 PM.

“ Dear Family of Olaf G. Aune

I, Jan Åge Riseth, am the first son of late Johan Riseth, Olafs first cousin. My grandmother Inga Riseth was the sister of Olafs mother Karen Aune.

It is both with grief and thankfulness I and my Family have received the sad message of Olafs passing away.

During my PhD studies I and my wife Randi Nymo and our children John Reidar, Bernt Henrik and Inga Marie stayed in USA the whole spring term 1996. In early summer we visited Valley City for the first time. Olaf and Mildred took us with love and caring. We stayed in their house for a couple of days and learnt them to know and also the Aune family history. Olaf was then 87 and seemed like a man in his 60s. Together with his nephew Ray Olaf also arranged a Family Reunion for us. It was a great experience to meet so many new relatives.

After that we kept in touch by letters and Christmas Cards. The summer 2009, when Olaf just had turned 100, I visited Valley City a second time, now together with my sons John Reidar and Bernt Henrik. Olaf had then moved into nursing home where we visited him. He took us out for dinner and the course served was brown trout just like the ones I fished as a boy! Surprise Olaf managed to arrange a Family Reunion this time too. We felt very much included in the Aune Family, and it was really great to be among you.

In the early fall 2010 my second cousin Andrew Aune and his spouse Fran, became the first American relatives to visit the spot in Mosvik, Nord Trøndelag, from where Oldus and Karen, and Olaf, emigrated over one century ago. Together with my father and brother and around a dozen of my cousins and their spouses we had two very nice days together. This had probably not happened if we had not established contact with the Aune branch of my family through Olaf.

We lost a bit direct contact with Olaf the last couple of years, but we still think much of Olaf and the Aune relatives.

We are happy and grateful to have learned Olaf to know and wish Peace over his memory.
