



## Russell Cary

November 30, 1918 - October 8, 2008

Russell Clifford Cary was born near Hawley, MN on November 30, 1918 to Ira and Lillie (Smith) Cary. He moved with his parents and brothers to a farm east of Ulen, MN in the early 1920's. He attended rural school and graduated from Ulen High School in 1936. After working on the family farm, he entered the US Air Force in July, 1941. Russell spent over two years in England as a T/Sgt in charge of crews doing repair of major battle damage on B-17 bombers. He spent the last months after returning from E.T.O. as a sheet metal instructor at Chanute Field, IL. After discharge from the service, he worked as a heating installer in Fargo, ND. Early in 1947, he started the Valley Heating Service in Valley City, ND, in partnership with Chester Gunness.

On January 18, 1948, he married Frances Hanson at Ulen. They made their home in Valley City. After selling out from Valley Heating Service in 1961, he spent 2 years traveling for a plumbing and heating wholesaler. Then he was a city mail carrier until retirement in 1980. Russ also was a real estate salesman. He moved to Arizona after Frances passed away on May 20, 2007. He belonged to the 379th Bomb Association Reunion Group, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, National Association of Retired Federal Employees, and National Association of Letter Carriers. One of his greatest loves was singing with the Valley City Troubadours.

Russell leaves his son, David (Laura) of Surprise, AZ; daughter, Lorna (Steve) Ozawa of Lakewood, CO; daughter-in-law, Kuang Cary of Mesa, AZ; granddaughters, Deena Cary of Los Angeles, CA, Stefanie Cary of Chicago,

IL and Nicole Ozawa of Lakewood; a brother, Harold (Eileen) Cary of Dilworth, MN; and numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife; son, Wayne; and 5 brothers.
